Minutes of the Port Ludlow Drainage District

Public Hearing

7:00 PM, 14 August, 2003

PLDD Commissioners Present: Richard Regan, Lee Amundson, and James Laker.

Gray & Osborne Engineer Present: Barry Baker.

Call to order:

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman Richard Regan at 7:00 PM. The first order of business was introduction of the Commissioners and Engineer present. In compliance with the Washington State requirements this public hearing was called to give the community an opportunity to comment on the Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan prepared by Gray & Osborne Inc. for the Port Ludlow Drainage District. Copies of the Plan could be checked out for a review from the Beach Club office prior to this hearing. Written comments have been accepted starting last month. Questions and comments were welcomed throughout this hearing. Public comment period officially closed after this meeting. Once comments are received and incorporated, officially adopted by the PLDD Commissioners Plan will be sent to the Jefferson County Commissioners for adoption as a part of an overall Jefferson County Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan. Mr. Baker made a presentation.

Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan:

Mr. Baker started by presenting the history of the PLDD. Stormwater Comprehensive Plan, completed as scheduled in June of 2003, was outlined and described chapter by chapter with the most emphasis made on Chapter 8: Capital Improvement Plan and Chapter 9: Financing Analysis. Mr. Baker reported PLDD first two capital improvement projects completed last month. One involved maintenance of the Area 7 detention pond, capturing water runoff toward Ludlow Bay; the other addressed a serious flooding problem affecting North Bay Condominiums. Oak Bay Conveyance System is next on the Commissioners' project list.

Mr. Baker presented the results of the Water Quality Testing done March 13, 2003 during a 2-year 24-hour storm. Although temperature, conductivity, and pH all read normal, fecal coliform exceeded criteria at all five sampling locations. Various explanations were presented. Second testing showed no water quality problems. Water Quality Testing will be one of the ongoing PLDD projects.

Public Hearing:

After the presentation Chairman Regan opened the floor for comments.

Responding to a question from the audience, the Commissioners clarified PLDD relationship with the County.

Mr. Baker was commended for completion of the Comprehensive Plan.

Public Hearing adjourned at 7:50 PM.


